Silver trumpet ≠ Ram's horn (shofar)

Only Kohanim (Sons of Aaron) can blow the silver trumpets and the shofar

When the Temple is restored, we cannot blow them

- Only the Sons of Aaron can

In Numbers 10:8, it tells us that the Sons of Aaron will blow the trumpets

The priests are important for also leading Israel to war (by blowing of the trumpets)

Yeshua will do the role of the priest of war when he returns

When the priest(s) of war has blood of the enemy on their garments, they can't do certain jobs in the temple

Blowing of the trumpets is under the jurisdiction of the priests within the realm of holiness

If (and when) the altar is restored and if we blow the silver trumpets, we are liable

ḥūq·qā(h)

- Decree
- Out of our jurisdiction to change
- Statute

Ram's horn/Shofar

- Only blown on Yom Teruah in the Temple and Yom Kippur on the Jubilee
- Yom Teruah
 - "The Last Trumpet"
- Yom Kippur on Jubilee
 - "The Great Trumpet"

The trumpets have many roles

- Going to war
- Announcements
- Part of liturgy and sacrifices

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The dedication of the Temple is God's enthronement on Earth

The trumpeting stone was on the SW corner

Kabbalat and Havdalah stem from the blowing of the trumpets in the temple to signal Shabbat

Musaf sacrifices are extra sacrifices done on Yom Tov

There is perfect order in God's kingdom

The liturgy in the synagogue comes from the Temple services
